



## Club Sports Champion's Cup

### Criteria:

Every club sport that is registered with The Office of Recreational Services will compete for points towards the Champion's Cup. The club sport at the end of the year that has the highest total of points will be named the top club sport at Winthrop University and rewarded the Club Sports Champion's Cup.

### Point System Breakdown:

The point system deadline is Thursday April 30.

- 1. Club Officers Elected: 25 Points**  
Clubs must have officers (president, vice-president, secretary, and treasurer) for the following academic year designated and turned into The Office of Recreational Services.
- 2. Budget Submitted for Following Year: 25 Points**  
Clubs must have the following academic year's budget turned into The Office of Recreational Services detailing all expected funding for club related expenses. Contact The Office of Recreational Services for any assistance in creating a club's budget.
- 3. Club Bank Account Meeting: 25 Points**  
Clubs must meet with The Office of Recreational Services to discuss any club related dues, sponsorships, and outside money being deposited into a club bank account to receive points.
- 4. Forms Submitted on Time: 40 Points**  
All of the following forms must be submitted to The Office of Recreational Services at the beginning of the fall semester:  
Each form is worth 10 points each.
  - Application and Registration Form
  - Liability Agreement
  - Coach's Agreement
  - Allocations Request
- 5. End of the Year Forms: 50 Points**  
All of the following forms must be submitted to The Office of Recreational Services at the end of the spring semester:  
Each form is worth 25 points each.
  - End of the Year Survey
  - End of the Year Report
- 6. Coordinator Meeting: 50 Points**  
A club must meet with the Coordinator for Intramural & Club Sports to discuss and plan for the club's budget and allocations request. A meeting must be arranged at the beginning of both the fall and spring semesters.
- 7. Increased # of Active Members: 50 Points**  
A club must increase their active membership by 20% throughout the academic year to qualify for points.
- 8. Zero Club Infractions: 50 Points**  
A club qualifies for points by not committing any infractions dealing with the club sport or any club sport related activities throughout the academic year.
- 9. Attending Club Sports Meetings: 75 Points**  
Attendance will be taken at every club sports meeting throughout the academic year. It is required that an officer from the club sport be present at 75% of the meetings to earn points.

**10. Inventory Report:****75 Points**

A club must set-up a scheduled time for an inventory check. All equipment purchased through club sports funding will be inventoried and processed.

**11. Off-Campus Events/Competitions:****75 Points Each**

At least 50% of the club's members must attend the off-campus event to qualify for points. It includes any approved travel off-campus for club events/competitions. Points will be awarded for each approved off-campus event/competition that the club participates in. Contact The Office of Recreational Services for approval on any desired off-campus events/competitions.

**12. On-Campus Events/Competitions:****100 Points Each**

Any approved event/competition that the club hosts on Winthrop University's campus. Points will be awarded for each approved on-campus event/competition. Contact The Office of Recreational Services for approval on any desired on-campus events/competitions.

**13. Cumulative Club Grade Point Average:**

Points will be awarded based on a club's academic achievement as a group. The Office of Recreational Services will look at the club's cumulative grade point average per academic year. There will be an optional release form to make club grades available to The Office of Recreational Services and to make the club eligible for points. The points will be awarded as follows:

- Below 2.0: -50 points**
- 2.1-2.5: 0 points**
- 2.6-3.0: 25 points**
- 3.1-3.5: 50 points**
- 3.6-4.0: 100points**

**14. Educational Opportunities:****150 Points**

An educational opportunity is one where the club is providing opportunities to the campus community to learn more about the club and club activities. A club must hold one educational opportunity per semester throughout an academic year to qualify for points. Contact The Office of Recreational Services for approval on all educational opportunity events.

**15. Community Service Projects:****150 Points**

At least 50% of club members must be present at all volunteer work to qualify for points. Also one community service project must be completed each semester to qualify for points. Contact The Office of Recreational Services for approval on all community service projects.

**16. Fundraising Activities:****200 Points**

Clubs must raise 10% of the funds that they requested from the club sports allocations committee at the beginning of the year. Contact The Office of Recreational Services for approval on all fundraising activities. *(Example: if a club requested \$2,000 in allocated money, they must raise 200 on their own as a club to gain the points.)*

- ***In the event of a tie between two or more clubs the following criteria will be used as a tiebreaker:***
- 1. Which ever club raised the most money while fundraising throughout the year.*
  - 2. Which ever club hosted the most on-campus events/competitions throughout the year.*
