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HONORS ADMISSION APPLICATION PROCESS

- Freshman admission based upon high school GPA, test scores and honors essay
- Requirements: 3.5 GPA, 1200 SAT or 27 ACT (excluding writing scores)
- Invitations to apply are extended beginning two weeks after the admission letter is mailed.
- Acceptance letters are mailed one week after the application and essay are received by the Honors Program.
- Transfer admission based upon cumulative GPA of 3.30.

REQUIREMENTS FOR THE HONORS PROGRAM DEGREE

General Education Component: Honors sections of "The Human Experience: Who Am I?" and "Critical Reading, Thinking and Writing" (6 credit hours)

Cultural Component: One honors symposium must be completed (1 credit hour)

Course Work Component: Completion of 15 credit hours of honors coursework with a minimum of six hours in the major and three hours outside the major.

Independent Study Component: A senior thesis/project must be completed in the major (3 credit hours) as well as the honors thesis symposium (1 credit hour).

Service Learning Component: A service learning class/project must be completed (0-3 credit hours).

REQUIREMENTS FOR THE HONORS PROGRAM DEGREE WITH INTERNATIONAL EXPERIENCE

Same components as the Honors Program degree and an extended experience in a learning environment outside the U.S.
