

More than 1,000 freshmen and 350 new transfer students were officially welcomed into the Winthrop family during the Aug. 25 Convocation ceremony that was held in Byrnes Auditorium for the first time since 2018. The annual ceremony serves as the kick off to the academic year. Attendees received words of welcome from university and student leaders, and participated in a new ceremony component called "Lighting the Winthrop Way." Each person lit a battery operated candle to symbolize the light of learning, shared values, and the connection between past, present and future members of the Winthrop community. After the

Nearly \$8 Million Raised to Close Out Fiscal Year 2024-25



Winthrop reported a near record-level year of giving during the 2024-25 fiscal year. Vice President for University Advancement Kevin Hughes said that 2,829 donors gave \$7,957,027 to the institution. That reflects a 73 percent increase in total giving over the 2023-24 fiscal year. The Winthrop Fund saw a 76 percent increase in dollars raised compared to last fiscal year, and the President's
Circle membership grew to 446, the highest number in Winthrop's history. Thank you to all of the donors and supporters who contributed to such a fantastic year of giving.

Long-time Organist David Lowry Receives Order of the Palmetto



S.C. Governor Henry McMaster granted and gifted an influential Winthrop organ professor the state's highest civilian honor, the Order of the Palmetto. Supporters

rallied this summer to petition the governor to bestow this coveted recognition to David Lowry, emeritus professor of music. It was presented to Lowry on Aug. 3 with a small group of former students and friends in attendance. Leading the effort were former students Lenora Morrow Jeffcoat '01, who was the last organ performance major taught by Lowry at Winthrop, and Jimmy Herlong, who is the son of the late Ann Herlong of Rock Hill and was a gifted pianist.
