Voting Now Open for Alumni Trustee Seat

Voting started Jan. 24 and runs through Feb. 25 for alumni to cast their vote for the next alumni trustee. The three candidates running for one of the two alumni-elected seats on Winthrop's [Board of Trustees](#) are Alison Hamilton '92, '95; David McDonald '01; and Endee Tate '21. The candidate who receives the most votes will serve a six-year term from 2022-28. All Winthrop alumni are able to vote for their candidate of choice by using their seven-digit alumni ID number, which was shared via the mailed fall Winthrop Magazine and postcard.

Presidential Search Process Reaches Next Stages

The search for Winthrop's 12th president is advancing. The university's search partner, Myers McRae, reports that more than 150 applications, including those of some sitting presidents, were received. The Presidential Search Committee recently met virtually to discuss applicants and chose a dozen or so candidates with whom the committee could interview over Zoom the last full week of the month. Off-campus interviews with candidates are tentatively scheduled for early February. Once the off-campus, in-person interviews are completed, the committee will invite announced finalists to campus.

Lutz Foundation's \$25,000 Grant Applied to Fountain Restoration Project

The Herbert and Anna Lutz Foundation recently [donated \\$25,000](#) to the university's Fountain Restoration Project. The fountain, a beloved campus landmark located in front of Tillman Hall, has been out of commission for a few years and needs replacement. A study commissioned by an anonymous donor in 2020 determined a design for a new fountain and the anticipated cost is \$500,000.

Adolphus Belk Jr. Named 2021-22 Thompson Scholar

Winthrop has appointed a new Thompson Scholar for 2021-22: Professor of Political Science Adolphus Belk Jr. The monetary award, generated through the Robert and Norma Thompson Endowment which was established during the university's first capital campaign, is given to support work on projects that strengthen the academic, intellectual and co-curricular life of the university. During his time as the Thompson Scholar, Belk plans to create a new course on hip-hop and politics that explores the issues raised in "For the Culture: Hip-Hop and the Fight for Social Justice," a book he co-edited with Lakeyta Bonnette-Bailey '04. 
Newest Virtual Alumni Book Club Selection Includes Contributions by Jeuel Bannister Esmacher '44
