BASIC RULES

In the event all entries lack sufficient merit, no prizes will be awarded. Entries will be judged by a faculty committee of the Department of Political Science.
- An electronic copy entry is due to Katie Hartnett (hartnettk@winthrop.edu), the Department of Political Science program assistant on or before Friday, March 8th, 2019 at 5pm. There is no minimum or maximum length.
- The winners will be announced in April. Prizes will be awarded at a special ceremony. The department anticipates (but does not require) that the winners will make a scholarly presentation based on their winning essay at this award ceremony.
- Students enrolled in PLSC 490 for the academic year will be automatically considered for the Byrd Award and the Janice Chastain Houk Award for Undergraduate Research, but not the Blough Award.
