#### 2021-2022 Reflection on Graduation Rates

When examining graduation rates, the metrics of 6-years for undergraduates, 3 years for MATs, and 4 years for advanced programs are used. This represents 1.5 times the number of years planned for each category.

#### **Undergraduate Teacher Certification**

The Educator Preparation Program (EPP) examines graduation rates based on the major at admission to the university as well as admission into the teacher education program (typically occurring by close of year two). When considering from point of University admission, rates vary but are trending down slightly with the highest in the report cycle being the 2013 cohort, which was 44.7% with a nine-year average of 38.3%. While a drop occurred in 2015 (36.5%) this is not unexpected due effects of the pandemic starting in 2019-2020. It is encouraging to see the 5.8% increase from 2015 to 2016. The EPP continues to use intentional advising when a student appears to be off course for graduation; provides support for requirements such as the testing and GPA; and implements flexibility where possible in the education core sequence as well as methods sequences in the two largest programs.

When only considering students that are admitted to the teacher education program, the graduation rates remain high (89.1% as an eleven-cohort average), but took a decline (16%) for the latest group. The impacts of the pandemic were notable for this group. For example, field experiences were greatly affected by non-traditional school schedules and virtual teaching. Additionally, testing availability and modality provided significant challenges. Trends are similar to statewide issues of teacher recruitment and retention. During this cohort, there was an uptick in students leaving the institution overall. Additionally, data shows a trend in students leaving EPP programs for non-EPP related programs including Educational Studies and we are investigating ways to address this trend, including diverse pathways to teacher licensure. Although some work has already begun, we expect this process to take time to implement fully and longer for the impact to appear in the graduation rates.

### Master of Arts in Teaching

There are multiple pathways within this degree that allow for use of accelerated design, programs addressing career changers, and a newly added residency model. We have included additional program areas to the accelerated design and recruited new students using grant resources. The thirteen-cohort rate of graduation is 79.6% with a dip (9.7%) in the latest group. These trends are less significant, but similar to the trends in eventual graduation rates for undergraduate teacher certification students. Again, we will continue to explore further efforts to continue increasing graduation rates.

### **Advanced Programs**

The graduation rate for advanced programs took a slight dip for the latest cohort (decreasing 1.2 points to 90.5%). This rate is similar to the graduation rates over the past three years. The EPP faculty continue to explore ways to best meet the changing needs of students in advanced programs, including the inclusion of more hybrid courses and digital tools to support learning and communication in these courses.
