I. Welcome and Announcements

II. Budget Update – Dr. Beth Costner, Interim Dean

- A. Probably not a surprise that Winthrop's enrollment is dropping and has been for years. But COVID has caused a dramatic drop in enrollment. The cost of education is fueling this.
- B. We're seeing for the 1st time a dramatic drop in retention after education students are admitted to Teacher Education (after the sophomore year). It used to be about 90% of these students were retained it's well below that now.
- C. Successful completion of Internship I is not leading to students continuing with Internship 2 as in the past. Some of these students are moving to interdisciplinary degrees Education Studies, for example.
- D. Another factor is we had the same budget model for many years, which was that departments / area had the same budget as the year before. But if your area is growing this doesn't work.
- E. The new budget model is based on enrollment but COE's enrollment has dropped which means a smaller budget.
- F. Winthrop and COE leaders are having serious talks about how we're going to make dramatic cuts needed over the next few years and we've been asked to make these over the next 2 years.
- G. COE enrollment has dropped 29.2% since 2017. From F20-21 it dropped 15.7%.
- H. There has been a significant drop in enrollment in the past 2-3 years.
 - 1. Winthrop watched this happen at other universities while WU's enrollment was going up. But now lower enrollment is affecting Winthrop.
- I. At the graduate level, since 2017 COE's graduate enrollment dropped 27% but only 1% since last year.
 - 1. Graduate and MAT programs seem very healthy. Enrollment in M.Ed. in Educational Leadership and Counseling, Leadership, & Educational Studies is good.
- J. Student caps early field courses. We went from 25 to 20 and now we need to go back to 25 or 26-27.
- K. Institution is trying to get to faculty/student ratio of 14:1 current COE is 12:1. In 2019 it was 13:1.
- L. How to do supervision loads / not just how many courses a faculty member is teaching but the credit hours. Supervisors are not as flexible when they can meet and visit schools as they used

to be. Now they may teach a full load and supervise. Administrators are also being asked to pick up courses. We're having to make dramatic cuts and it's not going to be easy.
