BIOGRAPHY

Vince DiMartino is one of the most well-known trumpet performers and educators in the world. Professor DiMartino taught at the University of Kentucky from 1972-1993 and held an appointment as a Distinguished Artist in residence at Centre College in Danville. Mr. DiMartino is equally known as a jazz and classical artist.

He has been the lead and solo trumpet in the Lionel Hampton Band, the Chuck Mangione Band, the Clark Terry Band, and The Eastman Arranger's Holiday Orchestra. Vince has been a member of the artist-faculty of the highly acclaimed Skidmore Jazz Institute since its inception in 1988, working with fellow artist-teachers Milt Hinton, Todd Coolman, Ed Shaughnessy, Frank Mantooth, Curtis Fuller, Dick Oatts, and Pat LaBarbera.

The International Trumpet Guild (ITG) has featured Mr. DiMartino as an artist-clinician in major solo programs at their conferences. He has served twice as President and Vice President of The ITG as well as a member of its Board of Directors for two terms. He also served as chair of the Board of Directors of The National Trumpet Competition in Washington, D.C.

Mr. DiMartino has appeared with many symphony orchestras including Cincinnati, Buffalo, Sante Fe, North Carolina, Orlando, Baton Rouge, and Rochester. He also appeared as a guest soloist at Lincoln Center with The Canadian Brass, The New York Philharmonic Brass, and The New York Brass in addition to touring with the Boston Pops. Mr. DiMartino was the first civilian to perform with The United States Marine Band.

Mr. DiMartino can be heard on many recordings including *Trumpet Summit* with Allen Vizzutti and Bobby Shew and with the DiMartino-Robinson duo on an album entitled *Orchestral Favorites for Trumpet and Organ*. The duo was awarded a National Endowment for the Arts Fellowship.

Vince DiMartino is an S.E. Shires Trumpet Artist and plays Pickett Brass Mouthpieces.
