This gift elevates musicianship, pedagogy, and access for students at all levels. These capital and equipment investments translate directly into stronger academic experiences and more vibrant public programming.

pedantry, erudition, and wit as he compares the musical philosophies of six ancient Greek scholars to his own musical experience in the late Baroque Period.




The Winthrop Chorale was invited to perform at SCMEA (South Carolina Music Educators Association) this upcoming February!


