 Any deviation to the recommended course sequence of program classes may result in delayed matriculation.

#### Notes:

- 1 = "General Education" university requirement. See list of approved classes in Winthrop's catalog, website, or scheduling bulletin.
- 2 = 2 designators needed; if PLSC201 or ECON103 are taken, designator must be different
- 3 = Requirements for review: completion or in progress all of: DES 113, 120, 150, 154, 222, 261 and INDS 213, 223 and 225 with a grade of C+ (minimum) in each class. The review is offered 3x per year and passage of the review is required for all INDS classes numbered over INDS 300. Courses numbered above INDS300 require a minimum grade of C to count toward progress in the major.
- 4 = If PLSC 201 or ECON103 are taken, then Const. Req. is met and requirement reverts to 'elective; student takes 1 (total: 3 cr. hr.) Soc. Sci. class to complete obligation. If HIST is taken, student must still take 6 hrs. Soc. Sci., 2 diff. designators.
- 5 = ALL students required to take at least 3 cr. hr. QUANT. and 1 "Lab Science" (6-7 cr. hrs. total). Last obligation (3-4 cr. hrs) can come from either QUANT. or Nat. Sci. (but, if Nat. Sci., must be different category than lab science course).

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
