#### **DIRECTOR'S NOTE**

The 25<sup>th</sup> Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee is a musical ABOUT a Spelling Bee....but it is more than that. This beautiful score and book are filled with outrageous laughs, bemoaning the treacherous life of middle school. What drew me to this show is the social construct of winning. "The best spellers don't necessarily win." This theme repeats often in this musical, and this caused me to delve deeper into the concept of winning. Winning (or losing) is a social construct that we have created and is often circumstantial. How we define it also depends on how we were raised. Were you taught to be ultracompetitive or more docile? Was competition thrust at you, or did you crave it? Winning never truly defines you or what you can become.

Spelling Bee examines winning, how to be competitive, and how that measures our success. Is this really the right message to give our children? Being kind, having empathy, being sincere, and being a good citizen are far better barometers of true success. The lessons we teach our children and how we treat one another, especially at this time in the world, must be handled with loving care.

I challenge that the losers don't really lose after all. Besides, who are they trying to win for? They themselves? Their parents? I invite you to take a closer look at the relationships between these parents and children and reflect on your own life. As parents, are we absentee, are we too blasé, or are we helicopter parents? This show also invites us into everyone's unique and complicated story. Each child (and the adults, too) deals with growing up and the challenges of adolescence in their own way. As parents, we might reexamine how much more complicated and far more capable children are than we give them credit for as they grow.

Sit back and experience the students' joy, pain, heartache, and spelling. And remember, "The best spellers don't necessarily win."
