

RISK/MITIGATION

Failure to hire professional advising staff could delay the implementation process. Failure to secure broad-based faculty buy-in could dampen a successful launch of the new shared advising model. To mitigate the risks, the Provost is holding listening sessions to gather feedback and concerns, while also sharing progress with all the key constituents.
