Present research at SOURCE.
Off campus opportunities	Attend the South Carolina Psychological Association conference or other local conferences.	Attend and/or present research at the Southeastern Association of Psychology conference (SEPA) or other regional conferences.	Attend and/or present research at national or international conferences. Publish a paper in a peer-reviewed journal, such as the Journal of Psychological Inquiry that publishes undergraduate work.

As undergraduate research is labor and time intensive, participation in certain programs may be limited. Students interested in participating in formal research experiences are encouraged to take ownership of their own development as scholars, and to take advantage of all of the resources available to them.
