Symphonic Band (MUSA 157)

A large wind and percussion ensemble of 60-80 members open to all students regardless of major. This ensemble performs two concerts per semester and rehearses and performs standard wind band repertoire of a variety of genres, styles, and cultures.

Symphonic Band/Wind Symphony Audition Process Fall 2025 (required of all music majors)

- Date and Time: Auditions will be held August 22-24. You will receive an email from Dr. Crochet in early August with the specific day and time for your instrument. If you do not receive this email, please contact Dr. Crochet.
- Place: Barnes Recital Hall report to the Green Room, which is accessed from the hallway behind the recital hall.
- Audition Preparation: You will be given music to prepare. If your music is lost, please contact Dr.
 Crochet to receive a new copy. Your audition is behind a screen. In addition to the prepared
 selection, you will be asked to sight read, and you may be asked to play a full range chromatic
 and major scales.
- Schedule Planning: Register for Symphonic Band. If you feel that you may be selected to participate in Wind Symphony, leave that time open in your schedule.
